## **Proper Cart Setout**

Here are some tips to ensure smooth collection on your next service day.

Place your carts at the curb by 6am on your collection day, and they will be picked up by 6pm that day.

**Cart Spacing** Place carts at least two feet apart with wheels against the curb to allow the truck arm to maneuver. Make sure your carts are at least 5 feet away from vehicles, basketball hoops and other obstructions.



**Overstuffed and Heavy Carts The** lids on your carts must be completely closed to avoid littering your streets.

coal bucket, or metal can be used to hold hot briquettes and ashes until ready for disposal. Make sure it is placed on concrete or some other non-combustible surface. When disposing of hot charcoal, it is best to gradually dump the charcoal into water rather than water onto charcoal. Stir after each addition

using a metal shovel. Water dumped onto charcoal can actually explode and cause injury. Once ashes are completely cold bag them before placing into your garbage cart. Remember, even ashes that seem cold on the surface may still be hot deep inside, even after sitting for two days, so wait at least 48 hours before disposing of them in the garbage cart. Do not place hot ashes or coals in your cart.

#### How to use your solar clothes dryer

That warm summer breeze just may help you save some cool cash this summer. By taking advantage of the breeze and the sun's rays to dry your laundry, you'll save on your energy bill, your clothes will last longer and your house will stay cooler too. Follow these tips for drying your laundry.

- Run an extra spin cycle if your washing machine has one. This will help drive excess water off and save time. Otherwise, wash your laundry as usual.
- Start with the biggest things first and space them evenly on both ends of your line or rack.

- Hang clothes inside out to prevent Ifading and enable faster drying of pockets.
- Before hanging each item, shake it and give it a good snap to eliminate
- Shade dry synthetic and silk fabrics; dry linen in the hot sun.
- If you don't like the stiff feeling of 6 line-dried clothes and towels, just tumble in the dryer for five minutes.

Enjoy your time outside. Your clothes will smell great, and the exercise and fresh air are almost as healthy as the amount of money you'll be saving.

## Ask Randy

Q: Randy, which method of grilling is more environmentally friendly, cooking with briquettes or gas grilling?

A: Good question! Propane gives off one-third the emissions than charcoal, but propane is a fossil fuel. Charcoal on the other hand, is made from trees, which are considered to be

a renewable resource, that would make them the carbon neutral option provided the charcoal is made from sustainable wood. So actually, they are about equal.

### **Protect yourself, protect recyclers** when disposing of batteries.

Commonly used batteries contain alkaline and carbon-zinc. Rechargeable batteries may have lithium, mercury-oxide, zinc carbon mercury, silverzinc, silver-oxide or nickelcadmium—this is highly corrosive and dangerous stuff. Some batteries may still contain a residual charge that can short-circuit if terminals come in contact with other battery terminals during storage and shipping.

To prevent accidents, the U.S Department of Transportation (DOT) recommends using the ONE bag rule. Place each battery into a separate plastic bag. If plastic bags are unavailable, cover battery terminals with electrical, duct or masking tape. If batteries appear dirty or to have a white powdery substance around the terminal, use caution when handling. Don't touch the dirty area and be

sure to wash vour hands just in case. For more information go to http://www.phmsa.gov/ hazmat.
